LAST HUNT FOR 2013?

September 7th was the last of the informal dates for the Black Powder Range for this year. These have been utilized for the first run at the Old West Centerfire Matches which bring back the skills and the arms of the Buffalo Hunting days in the 1870s and somewhat later. Tradition gave way to expedience as our targets were at much closer ranges than the buffalo hunting activities on the Great Plains. Be that as it may, nine shooters arrived loaded for game on the scheduled date. In addition to the participants, 'Reliable Tony' was there to fill the coffee cups and Dave Dolliver assisted with the scoring.

Prizes for the top three shooters were selected from C. Sharps Arms prizes provided thru Mike Nesbitt. Kay was presented with a special "Crazy Cora" award, being our only lady to shoot in these matches. Her prize was a print featuring a shooting family equipped with Highwall rifles like the one she used in the match. Following the match awards, aggregate awards were presented for the four matches held over the summer, again with an array of prizes donated by C. Sharps Arms. The aggregate scores were; 1st-Adam Sampson (750), 2nd-Bob DeLisle (719), 3rd-Tim Sampson (692), 4th -Allen Cunniff (682), 5th-Mike Nesbitt (661), 6th-Kent Dunn (519), 7th-Ron Folty (429), 8th-Will Ulry (323), 9th-Kay Lloy (164), and 10th- Don Kerr (116). Cumulative scores were compiled for all matches shot which were an advantage for those participating in all matches. Concluding the events for this venue for the year, there was a positive consensus on continuing this activity in some format.

High Power Shooters

August

Once the fog burned off, I was able to count 13 shooters on the line for the August Old Soldier Match. Today marked the first time we had two shooters with vintage World War II sniper rifles; Harvey Gertson (aka Private Jackson) with a U.S. Model 03A4 with a period correct 2.5X scope, and Dale Gigstead with a British No. 4 Sniper with a 3X scope. These two put on a good show with Private Jackson barely edging out his British competitor with a 279-5X to 278-4X.

But the really impressive shooting was from our old friend Tony Minerd shooting a Swiss K-31. Tony had a near-perfect score with 299-9X out of a possible 300. Better luck next time, Tony!

September

The morning was blustery, but we had a great time shooting the CMP Match and .22 rapid fire silhouette match. Then the Seahawks kicked ass on the Jacksonville Jaguars 45 to 17.

But first, the match. Tony Minerd used his AR-15 Match Rifle (Space Gun) to shoot an impressive 489-25X! Tony shot a perfect 200-13X in slow fire prone, 97-4X in rapid fire prone, 99-6X in rapid fire sitting, and 93-2X in slow fire standing. Outstanding shooting Tony! (William Murray offered to use Tony's rifle as a jack handle to change his flat tire....)

In the Service Rifle class, Gary Thorson tried out a new load with 52 grain Sierra Matchkings, and it seemed to pay off with 451-3X for 1st place. William Murray was right on Gary's heels with 448-4X for 2nd place. Nice shooting William. Ken Horton was on his game today, and shot 438-5X for 3rd place. That's only a 13 point spread between 1st and 3rd. William and Ken picked up 5 and 4 Distinguished points respectively. William is now at 18 points, and Ken at 13, and they both have a good chance of making the 20 point qualifier for CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman before the end of the year.

In the .22 rapid fire silhouette match, Rod McDonald (aka Weldingrod) again showed us all how it's done by clearing his 25 targets in an impressive 40.88 SECONDS! Late arrival and first-time shooter Paul Palustiac shot his first string on the black targets in 1:54, which would have earned him 4th place. However, on his second run on the white targets, Rod helped him out by shooting down half of Paul's white targets, which gave Paul a 2nd place time of 45 seconds. Nice way to welcome the new shooter!

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
