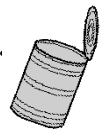




# The Plinker



## MISSION STATEMENT

## Attention: Action Pistol Range, Qualified Shooters

Because of the need for better security, there is now a new lock on the gate to the Action Pistol Range. This new lock is daisy-chained to the old lock. On January 1, the old lock will be permanently removed. All qualified shooters have until the end of December to obtain their new key to the range.

Until that time, you still have access to the range using the old lock. As soon as you obtain your new key, you will have access using the new lock. This is why the two locks are daisy-chained together. Please make sure that when you lock the gate to leave that you daisy-chain the locks and not the chain links.

The new lock and keys are quite expensive. These keys are not to be duplicated. Because of this, you will be required to pay a \$10 refundable key deposit when you obtain your new key. At that time, you will also be issued a new ID card.

If you have not paid your key deposit to receive your new key and ID card by the end of December, you will be required to re-qualify for access to the range.

In order to make this transition as easy as possible, I will be available on the range at the following dates and times:

Nov 17 from Noon til 1 pm

Nov 22 from 2 til 3 pm

Dec 6 from 6 til 7 pm

Dec 14 from Noon til 1 pm

Dec 15 from Noon til 1 pm

Dec 27 from 2 til 3 pm

## Beginner/Intermediate Handgun Match

Saturday November the 9<sup>th</sup> turned out to be a great day for a handgun match. We had a light fog that didn't want to burn off (and didn't), but it was not too cold, and best of all it didn't rain. This match definitely had something for everyone and was a challenge. We fielded 21 shooters that shot a total of 38 guns. We all had fun and no one lost the feeling in their toes or fingers, so it wasn't too bad.

In preparing for this match setup earlier in the week (according to long range weather forecast) I was preparing targets at home on Thursday and absolutely got drenched. I got so wet I had to change clothes to come into the house. After changing clothes I went immediately to the computer and changed the course of fire because the targets I just built would not stand up to the rain. A couple hours later a new course of fire was laid out with a new series of targets loaded in the truck and I was ready to hit the range for match setup.

Friday morning I got up early and looked out the kitchen window to see that the weather had totally cleared and I was now in a tizzy to change the course of fire back to the original that I had built on Thursday. Back to the computer, rewrite the course of fire, grab the original Thursday targets, and load them into the truck. You gotta love being a match director to do this. Just so I knew I had a backup plan I brought all of the targets and both courses of fire so if it rained I was covered.

Saturday morning came early as I arrived on the range at 7:30 AM to meet some of my setup crew to set the paper targets up (the Thursday targets) as the weather was still good. We actually set up the Match on Friday; however we always take down any paper targets after setup as they normally don't last through the night out there. We also put the correct courses of fire into the waterproof sleeves and placed them on their corresponding stage, and we were ready for shoot-in'. There were 5 stages of 10 rounds each for a perfect score total of 50, less any alibis.

7 Single Action Shooters tested their skills and told me this was a real challenge this month (we used up a lot of alibis on this one). We may have even created a few new alibis for this one!

**Mark your schedule for December 14th for the next Beginner Match and we will see you at the Action Pistol Range. Remember, our matches are usually held the second Saturday of each month. Don't forget, the December Match is our Christmas Match and it is a prize match. Start reloadin' early so yer ready on time.**

Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. **Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.**

## High Power Shooters

We had a good turnout of 10 shooters for the October Old Soldier Match. One of the highlights today was Fran Huntington presenting the Season Championship Awards for the M1 Garand Match and the Bolt Action Match. These matches were held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month from April through September. There were 6 matches in all, and Fran kept track of the 5 highest scores for each shooter through the season. He threw out the low score and also made allowance if someone couldn't make a match. We had 6 shooters who fired at least 5 M1 Garand matches to post championship scores, and 4 shooters qualify for the Bolt Action championship.

### **MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
