JUNE 2014 OLD WEST CENTERFIRES

The "Sharps shooters" gathered at the High Power Range on June 7th to compete and continue accumulating scores towards the seasonal aggregate. The course of fire included 20 rounds from the "buffalo guns;" 5 shots at 50 yards, 10 shots at 100 yards, and 5 more shots at 200 yards. Will Ulry's big and obvious shooter station numbers were available but Don & Mike still exchanged shots! Scott Isom assisted on the range and Karl Buckwalter and Bill Wirtaanen were interested visitors. Shooting skills are still improving and the spread in scores is excellent testimony thereof because only 17 points separate first from last place. Weather was essentially benevolent with some targets in the sunshine while others were in the shade.

Note: Placement shown is as it was announced at the range. The Range Director incorrectly looked at higher score at longer range rather than the number of "x's." Mike Nesbitt should have been recognized for 4th place and Don Kerr for 5th.

Aggregate prizes for all places were provided by C Sharps Arms through Mike Nesbitt plus a donation from Allen Cunniff were a variety of Sharps-themed prints and C Sharps Arms coffee cup. Our club provided Meat prizes for the top three scoring riflemen.

June M1 Garand Match

We had a light turnout for the June M1 Grand Match. But to augment our 6 shooters, we had 3 does, 1 buck, and a robin intent on feeding worms to her babies in a nest in the rafters at the firing line. That made for quite an interesting morning.

We had a close match for 1st and 2nd place. Gary Thorson took the win with 371-3X, and Tony Minerd was in a close 2nd place with 367-8X. With only 5 shooters completing the match, medals went to the top 2 places.

To commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Normandy Invasion, where more than a few M1 Garand's came ashore, Gentry Taylor performed a little known, and quite rare M1 maneuver known as an "Oprod Dismount". To perform such a maneuver, the shooter initiates the following sequence of events: pull the trigger; firing pin strikes primer, primer ignites powder, powder turns to high pressure gas, gas expels the bullet out the barrel and simultaneously forces the operating rod to the rear, operating rod inadvertently disengages from the bolt, leaving the bolt in battery with the expended cartridge case still in the chamber. That is the infamous "OPROD DISMOUNT". Not to be deterred, Gentry set his M1 aside for later disassembly and reassembly, and finished out the match with his scoped Sniper Challenge AR-15.

Four shooters also shot the Bolt Action match. The other 2 are apparently feeling the effects of scarce reloading supplies and high priced .30-06 ammo. Gary Thorson decided to actually play fair this month and shoot a legitimate bolt action rifle, a U.S. Model 1903-A3 Remington. Gary won the match shooting 367-8X. Not to be outdone, Jason Koppelberger got everyone's attention shooting his custom Mosin Nagant with a fiberglass stock, cut down barrel, scout scope, and custom paint job. This is a true hand held artillery piece, with the roar of a cannon and a fireball 2 feet out the muzzle! It was pretty hard to score a burnt target.

Following the match, we had our Sniper Challenge. Gary Thorson won the pot hitting 5 for 5 on the 6-inch gong at 200 yards. This is the first time anyone has cleaned 5 for 5 in the Sniper Challenge.

Gary Thorson, 1st, 5 hits (AR-15 with scope)

Gentry Taylor, 2nd, 3 hits (AR-15 with scope)

Gary Baldwin (M1 Garand), Tony Minerd (1903-A3), and Jason Koppelberger (FN Police Special with scope) all had 1 hit.

Old Soldier Match

We had a good turnout of 11 riflemen for the June Old Soldier Match. And we had some really good shooting going on. Out of a possible 300 points, seven shooters scored above 275. Good shooting, guys! Tony Miner became the 3rd shooter to achieve CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman by earning 5 points in the match, putting his total for the year at 21. Congratulations, Tony! Gary Baldwin narrowly missed it, and currently stands at 19 points. Tony also brought his friend Curtis Duning to shoot his first high power rifle match. Welcome, Curtis. Curtis was energetic enough to make a couple of extra trips down range to chase deer, and fix a malfunctioning 6-inch gong. The Match Director would like to publicly state, just for the record, that sending the new guy down to chase the deer is NOT match policy, an initiation, or some form of rite of passage. But it's not a bad idea, and the old guys sure do appreciate it!

Conspicuously absent from the match was Fran Huntington, and everybody was asking where Fran was. It was reported (but could not be independently verified) that Fran's personal assistant over-booked his social calendar. Sounds like someone has an issue with setting proper priorities.

We had an additional visitor at the match: Mike Dorsett. Mike recently moved to the Olympia area from Bainbridge Island, and was interested in shooting at the club. We found out that Mike owns an M1 Garand. So, Mike, we hope you show up for the M1 Garand Match on the 2nd Sunday of July.

May CMP Match

And then the rains came... about an hour after we were done with the May CMP Match. We had eleven shooters and three deer participate in the match. The Rapid Fire Prone stage was quite exciting. You can go out hunting and there won't be a deer to be found within miles. But come to CCR&P, line up 11 guys with semi-auto rifles, send 110 rounds down range in a minute, and they walk right out in front of you. We called a quick "Cease Fire!", and fortunately the doe wasn't hit. The first time I pulled targets in the pits, it was a bit unnerving hearing the bullets make that sonic CRACK! over your head. It didn't seem to faze the doe one bit. She just stopped to eat grass. After clearing the line, and sending someone down range to coax the deer into the woods, we continued with the Rapid Prone string. Then, when walking down to score targets, we noticed the other two up at the top of the 200 yard berm. When 11 guys got within 50 yards of them, they moseyed over the top.

But that wasn't the only excitement for the day. We made a little of our own. Tony Miner shot his AR-15 Match Rifle to take the high score in 3 out of 4 stages, and post the match high score of 482-14X. Good shooting, Tony!

The other 10 shooters competed in the Service Rifle class. Fran Huntington took the match win shooting an AR-15 for 469-6X, and shot a 93-1X in Slow Fire Standing to actually beat Tony! Medal winners in the Service Rifle match were:

Finally, we shot the Carbine Match on the "5V" targets at 50 yards. Bruce Fockler shot the match for the first time with a newly assembled AR-15 M4 carbine "parts gun". Bruce took the win, edging out Fran Huntington by 2 V's, 188-4V to 188-2V. Bruce was all smiles; he likes this game! But Fran has nothing to be disappointed about considering that Bruce's AR is brand new, and Fran's M1 Carbine is 70 years old.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
