- Meeting called to order at 7p.m. by Ray C. Flag salute led by Bob G.
- Doug S. presented the Treasurer's report. Doug also found that CCRP last donated to The Friends of the NRA in 2015 in the amount of \$250.00. Last meeting the board approved the same amount as "last time". John M. moved to accept the treasurer's report as read. Will U. seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye".
- John M. reported last month membership at 702 members. Today membership is at 696. New Member Orientation Training will continue in May. Discussion about assessment credit for members that bring new members. (a new member brought two new members with him). The "sponsor" will get four assessment hours for each new member (8 hours in this case). Doug S. will research where this is found and report next month. Suggested there be a reminder in *The Plinker* regarding this. Discuss where this should reside in the CCRP documents (policy, standing rules, etc.).

### MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

## May 2017 Muzzle Loading Match Report And the weatherman smiled

Match day, Saturday, May 6th, found clear skies and a bit of soggy underfoot but otherwise calm and benign with no excuses for wind or poor visibility. Eleven Free Trappers were on hand for this 'end-of-the-season' event which called for 'rifles only' to be shot on one paper target and then ten more shots on the trail walk plus one more shot on the tiebreaker. After a brief shooters' meeting, upcoming dates were acknowledged with our main focus on Saturday, June 24<sup>th</sup> for some trail walk repair in preparation for the Many Rivers event which will be held in August. Information regarding Oregon Trail Days included possible modified parking for the event with details to be forthcoming. All was hastened due to the absence of the Match Director's coffee pot which was not as critical as had been in cooler weather. Then the good shooting proceeded with target scoring assistance from Tom Brown who also obliged by acting as range security during the trail walk phase.

A single relay was staged for the double-bull 50-yard buffalo targets and a lapse in match director instructions was later attributed to accumulated scores. Fitting for the day there seemed to be minimal "guntrouble" other than some untimely flint deterioration. For the Trail phase of the match, our shooters divided in two trail groups and worked the trail targets from each end. Only one target was missing, the rabbit 'left for dead' from the last Rain-Dee-Voo. The effects of the early wet spring were readily apparent in the already serious undergrowth, mostly ferns, which made locating some of the target a bit of a challenge, more so for some than others.

After the trail phase was complete, scores were compiled as the basis for individual awards. Aggregate placings were; 1<sup>st</sup>- (top flintlock) Bob DeLisle, 2<sup>nd</sup>- (top percussion) Clarence Atchison, 3<sup>rd</sup>-Will Ulry, 4<sup>th</sup>-Roy Williams (whose perfect 10 on the trail made up for his discharge of only 5 shots instead of ten on the 50-yard paper), 5<sup>th</sup>-Rowland Zoller, 6<sup>th</sup>-Mike Nesbitt., 7<sup>th</sup>-Don Kerr, 8<sup>th</sup>-Bob Gietz 9<sup>th</sup>-Jerry Mayo (determined by his tie breaker putting him ahead of), 10<sup>th</sup>-Ralph Birmingham, and 11<sup>th</sup>-Dewayne Pritchett shooting this "rifle match" with his Trade Gun.

The next proximate muzzle lodging event will be the Evergreen Muzzleloaders' match next Saturday, May 13th, 2017 starting at 0930 just for rifles with blanket prizes needed to participate in the aggregate awards. The next Old West Centerfires match will be Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> on a range yet to be determined. No progress is yet scheduled for improvements on the High Power range and so it may not be available for our OWC Match in which case that match will be on the Black Powder Range.

Two items identified for needed Black Powder range repair are: 1<sup>st</sup>, the installation of new stove pipe for which materials are on hand for someone with sheet metal skills and, 2<sup>nd</sup>, disposition of the "out of service" range table which would be a source of weathered board materials for a crafter willing to salvage and remove same.

Low and behold, Tom Schuettke took the win with the fastest total time of 2 minutes and 5 seconds to knock down 50 silhouettes.
