August 2018 Old West Centerfires Match Report

Fair weather means no weather alibis

Ten shooters were present for this fifth Old West Centerfires match in the 2018 series. Our weather was calm, sunny and mild, and bright sun on the sights doesn't excuse less than optimum scores. A positive note is that Don Kerr was back with us with improving attitude and marksmanship. A visitor to today's match was Wesley Davis, along with J.R. Ritter (Jeff's son) came to participate. Wesley's connection is through military service with J.R.

The after-match competition took a different form today thanks to two silhouette targets made by Young's Point Manufacturing in Billings, Montana, obtained by Mike Nesbitt at the recent Quigley match. They are scaled-down replicas of targets used at Quigley; a Buffalo silhouette, scaled down from the 805-yard target and a smaller "bucket" which at Quigley is posted at 350 yards and shot at offhand. For our event the buffalo was shot at 200 yards using cross-sticks and the bucket at 100 yards from the offhand position. One relay was shot at each range (200 and 100 yards) with the shots fired in sequence as called by the Match director. All shooters participated in this event with scores combined to determine the winner which turned out to be a tie between Bob DeLisle and Phil Wiebe. Incidentally Bob used a newly acquired C. Sharps Arms 1874 "Hunter's Rifle/Carbine in .50/70 and he's using it with the open sights rather than target sights.

Match prizes were awarded for the aggregate scores with selection for a combination of club-provided meat prizes, plus merchandise items from C. Sharps Arms and SPG Sales. First place went to Jeff Ritter shooting a Shiloh/C. Sharps 1874 in 40/65 (that's a Shiloh rifle that was re-barreled by C. Sharps Arms) with scores of 98-3X at 100 yards and 92-2X at 200 yards for a combined score for the day of 190-5X. We don't often get a score for the day in the 190s... Second was taken by Mike Nesbitt with his heavy C. Sharps Arms Model '74 "Buffalo Gun" in .44/77, scoring 179-2X. Third went to Allen Cunniff shooting his custom C. Sharps Arms .45/70 and getting a score of 178-X. Fourth was Bob DeLisle shooting his Pedersoli .45/70 with paper patched bullets and scoring 175-3X. In fifth we find Will Ulry using his Shiloh Sharps .45/70 and getting a score of 166X. Sixth was our newcomer, Wesley Davis, shooting a copy of a Winchester Highwall in .45/70 for a score of 152X. Claiming seventh place was Jerry Mayo with his C. Sharps Arms '74 Hartford in .45/70 for a score of 136X. Don Kerr landed in eighth place, with a score of 136X shooting his long-range target styled C. Sharps Arms '74 rifle in .45/90. Ninth place went to Phil Wiebe who was shooting his C. Sharps Arms Model 1875 rifle in .45/70 and getting 135. Then tenth place went to J. R. Ritter who was using his dad's Remington rolling block in .45/90 and earning a score of 125X.

The next Old West Centerfires match, hopefully to be shot at 100 & 200 yards again, will be held on September 1st, 2018, on the High-Power Range or possibly on the Black Powder range (for 50 and 100 yards) if new range re-construction is underway on the High-Power range. This, again, is at the Capitol City Rifle & Pistol Club just out of Littlerock, Washington.

In an informal discussion a lot of interest was expressed in some sort of combined "Buffalo Camp" event which would include camping with a variety of shooting possibly on High Power and Black Powder ranges. Discussion and scheduling for this Buffalo Camp are ongoing.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
