- Treasurer's Report given by Doug S. John M. motioned to accept the Treasurer's Report as read. Will U. seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye".
- Membership report given by John M. 14 new members at the last new member orientation class. Currently membership is approximately at 710 members.
- Eric B. shared that the dirt work is complete at the Multipurpose Range and the Action Pistol Range.
- Much discussion regarding the opening of the Multipurpose range, and what that may look like.
- Bob J. reminded the board that the forest manager contract is due for renewal. Chris M. will visit with him.
- Eric B. found a member licensed to plumb gas line that was willing to install the propane gas line into the Indoor Range. John M. motioned to allot a not-to-exceed amount of \$500 for materials needed for this gas plumbing project, and up to six hours at \$75/hour to exchange for assessment hours. Terry M. seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye".

- Chris M. visited with Dragon Analytical Laboratory about testing the water at CCRP. An all inclusive test

## September 2018 Old West Centerfires Match Report

Ten shooters were present for this final Old West Centerfires match in the 2018 series. Weather was calm and peaceful, just right to be disturbed by clouds of GOEX black powder smoke and the crowd of famil-

iar faces was here to do just that. Wesley Davis, along with J.R Ritter (Loco Jeff's son) came back to participate. A newbie visitor (to black powder cartridge shooting), Tony Woore, who is familiar to muzzle loading events came to observe and to try a few short-range targets in the interest of "dialing-in" his own Sharps in .45/70 and even participate, offhand in the after-aggregate match.

The after-aggregate match competition used the same two silhouette targets made by Young's Point Manufacturing in Billings, Montana, brought home by Mike Nesbitt when he returned from the recent Quigley match. They are scaled-down replicas of targets used at Quigley; a buffalo silhouette, scaled down from the 805-yard target and a smaller "bucket" which at Quigley is posted at 350 yards and shot at offhand. For our event the buffalo was shot at 200 yards across cross-sticks and the bucket at 100 yards from the offhand position. One relay was shot at each distance (200 and 100 yards) with the shots fired in sequence as called by the match director. Six shooters participated in this event. A tie be-



tween Mike Nesbitt, Jerry Mayo and Don Kerr was settled easily because Mike had the most hits on the bucket which is the tiebreaker, the offhand shots, and pocketed the \$6 prize pot. No small feat considering that Mike was using his 15-pound .44/77 by C Sharps Arms.

Match prizes were awarded for the aggregate scores with selection for a combination of club-provided meat prizes, plus merchandise items from C. Sharps Arms, SPG Sales, and Wolfe Publishing Company. First place went to Jeff Ritter shooting a Shiloh/C. Sharps Arms Model 1874 in .40/65 (that's a Shiloh rifle that was re-barreled by C. Sharps Arms) with excellent scores of 93-X at 100 yards and 96-X at 200 yards for a combined score for the day of 189-5X. Second place was taken Bob DeLisle shooting his Pedersoli .45/70 with paper patched bullets and scoring 180-4X. Third went to Don Kerr with a score of 180-3X shooting his long-range target styled C. Sharps Arms Hartford '74 rifle in .45/90. Our fourth-place shooter was Mike Nesbitt shooting his "buffalo-slayer" 15-pound C Sharps Arms Hartford in .44/77 scoring 88-2X at 100 yards and 92 at 200 for a 180-2X total.

Mike had an interesting thing happen to him. One of his shots at his 100-yard target was a true flier and the cartridge case separated when the shot was fired. That shot scored a 6, out at 2 o'clock. Otherwise Mike had a very nice group going, nice enough that it could be seen from 100 yards without using a scope. We might also note that shooters placing 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> all had the same score with the exception of X's.

Fifth was Jerry Mayo with his C. Sharps Arms '74 Hartford in .45/70 for a score of 172-3X. Sixth was Sam Snelson, scoring 162-2X with his 1874 C Sharps Arms rifle in .45/100. Allen Cunniff placed seventh shooting his custom C. Sharps Arms .45/70 (with new "untrained" glasses) and getting a score of 150. Eighth place went to Phil Wiebe who was shooting his C. Sharps Arms Model 1875 rifle in .45/70 and getting 120-X. Ninth went to Wes Davis, shooting Mike Nesbitt's heavy '74 Sharps in .50/70 caliber shown here, scoring 115-X. Wes would have done better if he had done his shooting while someone else spotted for him. Tenth-place went to J. R. Ritter who was using an early Remington rolling block in .45/70 to earn a score of 97.

At this last match for the 2108 season, the overall aggregate placings were determined by combining results from this match with the accumulated seasonal scores. We hold six matches per "year" and the aggregate scores are based on each shooter's best five match scores. Four shooters, who had shot in all the matches, already had five matches on record and these were Mike Nesbitt, Don Kerr, Jerry Mayo, and Phil Weibe. Rewards for these fine scores were also comprised of meat prizes and a variety of products from C. Sharps Arms along with subscriptions and special merchandise. For the balance of the competitors present at this final event score was determined combining today with the total their previous scores. Results were; 1st- Jeff Ritter

with a of total 913-15X, 2<sup>nd</sup>-Mike Nesbitt with 905-13X, 3<sup>rd</sup>- Don Kerr 893-15X, 4<sup>th</sup>- Bob DeLisle 862-8X, 5<sup>th</sup>- Allen Cunniff 847-7X, 6<sup>th</sup>-Jerry Mayo 792-7X, 7<sup>th</sup>-Sam Snelson 699-11X, 8<sup>th</sup>- Phil Wiebe 563-3X, 9<sup>th</sup>- J.R. Ritter with 395-3X J.R. Ritter and 10<sup>th</sup> -Wes Davis (who shot in only two matches) with 267-2X.

To say the least, this season of our Old West Centerfires matches end with high notes as well as highly noted increased interest in black powder cartridge shooting. All shooters are eagerly looking forward to our 2019 season which will begin in just two months, with our first match of the coming season on November 17<sup>th</sup>. And we will have the Buffalo Camp over the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in October so there is a lot of black powder cartridge shooting to be done. # MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
