### Do You Want To Be A Better Shooter?

Do you want to improve your rifle shooting skills? Don't like shooting in the dark and the rain? Can't find anything good to watch on TV? Then come join us every Wednesday night at 6:30 PM on the Indoor Range for rifle practice.

We open the Indoor Range up for CCR&P club members from 6:30 to 8:30 PM every Wednesday night until the end of March. This is a semi-formal shooting session. We always have at least one NRA certified Range Safety Officer present to run the session, and the experienced shooters are always happy to help out new shooters improve their techniques. We organize it into four 10-minute sessions, with plenty of time between sessions to change your targets, warm up by the wood stove and have friendly conversation.

We practice shooting in the prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing positions. Or you can shoot the entire session in one position if you choose. You can use any .22 LR rifle, with scope or open sights. The usual course of fire is 10 shots in 10 minutes, using the NRA A-17 target at a distance of 50 feet. Targets are provided for you.

#### October 2019 Muzzle Loading Match Report

### Mild Fall Weather on the Range.

There were twelve shooters on hand on Saturday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, at the CCRP Black Powder Range. Mild weather, fog- and rain-free with good visibility was observed. We had a good contingent of the "usual suspects" on hand and a familiar returnee in the person of Rich Pogue. The order of fire for this, the first muzzle-loader match of the range season was for rifles firing ten shots on paper at the 50 yard double-bullseye buffalo target, with 5 shots on each bullseye, followed by the trail-walk for the first ten rifle targets and the tie-breaker. Combined scores determined aggregate placing for the prizes on the blanket.

Helping during this event was Tom Brown who scored, checked, and posted the match results. Will Ulry, Rain-dee-voo Booshway, was on hand to bring the results of planning meeting up to date. Recruiting continued with several volunteers coming forward. There is a remaining need for some trail guides and confirmation of cooking capable assistance for the kitchen.

A meeting during Rain-dee-voo will be held to confirm details for Oregon Trail Days. Dates for OTD are set for July 23d to 26<sup>th</sup>. Several other Free Trapper details were discussed. Tom Brown was approved to arrange for 500 "Wooden Nickels" for present and future events. Jerry Mayo was requested to get "Rain-dee-voo" display banners for the road-side signs. Details of upcoming monthly shoots were discussed. By opinion, bonus points for primitive dress were changed to three items for a 5 point bonus per event. The Many Rivers Rifle Frolic has been canceled due to lack of interest.

Prizes for the aggregate of trail-walk and range scores were blanket items donated by the participants. Bob Gietz did not compete due to rifle lock and vision problems.

Coming events: Evergreen Muzzleloaders monthly shoot is next Saturday, October 12th, and it is for pistols on both range and trail. The match starts at 09:30, \$5.00 fee. The next Free Trappers event will be the Annual Turkey Shoot on the Black Powder Range on Saturday November 2<sup>nd</sup>. The fee will be \$16.00 and the aggregate blanket will be prized with turkey items by the Free Trappers. Competition will be for rifles, pistols and trade guns including flyers. Primitive clothing will be included for bonus points awarded for three items, including but not required primitive footwear. Range setup will be the preceding day, Friday November 1<sup>st</sup> starting at 2:00 PM on the Black Powder Range. And on November 16<sup>th</sup> we'll have the first Old West Centerfires match for the 2020 season, on the High Power Range with 10 shots at 100 yards plus another 10 shots at 200 yards. We can expect to have an after-aggregate match for another 10 shots at gongs. November is a rather busy month.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

NRA membership (required)

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
