The mist, combined with black powder smoke produced unexpectedly challenging conditions when combined with the seasonally low sun angle. Conditions improved as the morning went on as well as the shooters' disposition. The order of fire for this, the second muzzle-loader match of the range season was for the full arsenal of front-stuffers, rifles, pistols and trade guns with a combination of paper and reactive targets for each as well as clay pigeon flyers for the trade guns to conclude the match. Each category was recognized with prizes for first, second, and third. Combined rifle and pistol scores determined aggregate placing for the prizes on the blanket.

Helping during this event was Tom Brown who scored, checked, and posted the match results. Will Ulry, Rain-Dee-Voo Booshway, was on hand to bring the results of planning meeting up to date and provided details of the Tenino raffle this year featuring a custom made suit of buckskins. A calendar conflict for the March activity was resolved by moving the March monthly match to the last day of February due to unexpected schedule of the Monroe Pioneer Craft and Muzzle loading event. Recruiting continued with several volunteers coming forward. There is a remaining need for some trail guides and confirmation of cooking capable assistance for the kitchen.

Anticipating Thanksgiving, the theme for this match was the quest for the seasonal dinner guest of honor, the turkey. Both paper targets and reactive gongs had turkey figures incorporated. And the awards carried this theme out as well. The soda can luck shoot had a turkey head as he designated target and the luck shoot award went to Wes Davis. Awards for the individual rifle, pistol, and trade gun matches were comprised of turkey based consumables (kielbasa, turkey bacon and turkey wieners). Coming events: Evergreen Muzzleloaders monthly shoot is next Saturday, November 9th, and it is for rifles on both range and trail, put on by Jess Snow. The match starts at 09:30, shooting fee \$5.00. On November 16<sup>th</sup> we'll have the first Old West Centerfires match for the 2020 season, on the High Power Range with 10 shots at 100 yards plus another 10 shots at 200 yards. We can expect to have an after-aggregate match for another 10 shots at gongs. November is a rather busy month.

The next Free Trappers event will be the Annual Brown Bag Christmas on the Black Powder Range on Saturday December 7<sup>th</sup>. The fee will be \$11.00 plus extras and the aggregate blanket will be prized with brown Bag items by the Club. Competition will be for rifles, pistols, and trade guns including flyers. Primitive clothing will be included for bonus points with 5 points awarded for three items, including but not required primitive footwear. Range setup will be the preceding day, Friday December 6<sup>th</sup>, starting at 2:00 PM on the Black Powder Range.

## **A Foggy Beginning**

For this first OWC match of the new shooting year (for our 2020 season) we had ten shooters which is a good beginning considering the competition with hunting. Our match had a rather foggy beginning which lifted just about at the right time. Shooting was in two relays starting on the 100 yard range and trusting that visibility would improve. And it did clear as the match progressed although calm conditions still caused some waiting time between shots for smoke to clear. It was a good beginning for the new season because scores showed improvement with eight out of ten on the 100 yard range at 80 or above and seven out of ten at the 200 yard distance were above 90.

We had a returnee with us today in the person of Kent Dunn. Also there were two welcome visitors, Don Kerr's sons from back east (Maine and Massachusetts), Warren and Doug Kerr. It was good to see them all.

Best score for the day was filed, in absentia, by Allen Cunniff who shot early and had his targets witnessed by Mike Nesbitt. Allen's score of 188-6X was compiled of an 88-X at 100 yards and a 100-5X at 200 yards. Loco Jeff Ritter compiled an identical score with an 89-2X plus a 99-4X. Allen prevailed by virtue of having the higher score at the greater distance but Jeff's rolling block Remington barreled for .45/90 certainly served him very well today. Close behind with a total score of 186-3X was Jerry Mayo in third place. In fourth place was Mike Nesbitt, shooting a new rifle. That's a .45/70 in a 1874 Bridgeport Model with a 34-inch barrel. Mike's score with that new rifle was 185-3X. Fifth place went to Jeff R. (Doc) Ritter, shooting the 1874 Sharps in .40/65 and doing very well at with a score 100 yards of 84-X, and a 96 out at 200 yards, totaling 180-X. Sixth place saw Don Kerr, continuing his comeback to the world of good Sharps shooting, using his C. Sharps Arms '74 Hartford Target Rifle in .45/90 to shoot an 89 at 100 yards followed by a 91 at 200 yards for a total score of 180. Bob DeLisle placed 7th this time, shooting his paper patched bullets for a 176-X total with an 88 at 100 and a 88-X at 200, this shows good consistency at least. Eighth place went to Kent Dunn, with his Pedersoli Sharps 1874 .45/70 scoring 76 at 100 and 96-X at 200, combined to 172-X. Warren Kerr borrowed a C. Sharps Arms 1874 in .50/70 from Mike Nesbitt to take ninth place. Phil Wiebe with his own C. Sharps Arms 1874 in .45/90 posted an 80 from his 100 yard score and declined to turn in for 200.

The after-aggregate gong match provided some competition for the five who ponied up one more dollar to participate. Top silhouette shooter in a run-a-way posting of 4 at 200 yards and 5 off-hand hits at 100 yards was Douglas Kerr using the Nesbitt-loaned .50/70.

#### Do You Want To Be A Better Shooter?

Do you want to improve your rifle shooting skills? Don't like shooting in the dark and the rain? Can't find anything good to watch on TV? Then come join us every Wednesday night at 6:30 PM on the Indoor Range for rifle practice.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

NRA membership (required)

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
