## Wednesday Night Indoor .22 Rifle Instructional League

Do you want to practice and improve your rifle shooting during the cold, dark, rainy winter? Well, we have a deal for you.

Every Wednesday evening at 6:30 PM beginning in October and running through the end of March, we will be opening the Indoor Range for .22 rifle shooting. This will be for CCRP Club Members only. The gate will not be locked open, and you will need your key card to get in. There is no charge for this event, and targets will be provided. When we run out of targets, we'll all chip in to buy some more.

This will be a semi-formal shooting session on the Indoor Range, with targets at 50 feet. NRA certified Range Safety Officers will be present to run the line. We usually run four 10-minute firing sessions, with plenty of time between sessions to change targets, chat with your friends, and warm up next to the wood stove. We typically shoot prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing positions. But you can shoot any position you wish.

You can use any .22 rifle you wish; .22 short, long, or long rifle. No magnums, please. Open sights or scope. If you use a semi-auto rifle, please remember that this is target shooting, so no "Mag-dump blasting" will be allowed.

Starting in January, several of the regular shooters will form a team to participate in the National Rifle League postal league competition. You are welcome to join the team, or if you want to just come and shoot for fun, that's fine.

The course of fire for the league is all slow fire, 10 shots in 10 minutes. We shoot four 10-minute stages; prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing. Scores are submitted online to the league web site. There are usually around 35 teams from all over the U.S. and Canada participating in the league.

Come out and join us. It sure beats watching TV.

## **Hunters Sight In**

Well my 26 guys got 28 Hunters ready to shoot their game animal right in the eye. We had a couple of exceptional shooters and it was fun watching them get dialed in. The first weekend was lightly attended with 8 shooters. The one good thing about both weekends was the food. The archery guys lent us their BarB and we toasted up some fine burgers. We didn't feed all shooters but if you were there at noon you may of opted for a fine burger. The second weekend 18 shooters were on sight. The range has been reserved only for Hunters Sight in forever. No others have been allowed. Three or 4 years ago I realize some club members were not happy about being turned away. So at that time we reserved a couple of benches for members. That has worked out real well. It's obvious some members are not used to being held up for target setting and things but all worked well. ## **Published Notice of an Amendment to the Club Bylaws**

This notice will be published for three months in the Plinker and on the club website in accordance with CCRP Bylaws. A vote by the full Board of Directors will follow at the first meeting after the three months.

A clarification is needed in paragraph G of Article IV and is added as the ending sentence of paragraph G as follows:

"Work hours and certifications are to be recorded on the assessment work hours card and the original submitted by the member, completely filled out, with the member's annual dues and proof of NRA membership upon receipt of their annual invoice."

While the assessment deduction for new member recruitment has been in effect for some time now, the decision was never voted into the club Bylaws. The following paragraph is to be placed at the end of paragraph G under Article IV.

"Members may reduce their annual assessment of \$80.00 by recruiting new members who join the club. The reduction is \$40.00 per new member and is limited to two reductions per calendar year. Accordingly, two new members will bring the recruiting member's assessment to a zero balance for that member's calendar year and will be credited to the member's account for the anniversary following the recruiting. Recruiting assessment reductions are applicable only to assessments, will not apply to dues, are not transferable nor do they roll-over to the following year if more than two new members are recruited in one year. The recruiting and proof of the new member's completion of the New Member Orientation can be recorded on the assessment work hours cards, certified by the NMO instructor, the club Training Officer, or a member of the Executive Committee, and then submitted by the recruiting member with their annual dues and proof of NRA membership."

We had an even split on rifles, with 3 shooters using modern AR-15 Service Rifles with 4X scopes, and 3 shooters using old school M1A Service Rifles with open sights.

Match winner was Tom Schuettke who used his AR-15 to shoot a score of 475-15X. That's a Master Class score, folks! Tom also had the high score in slow fire prone with 199-10X out of a possible 200, and the high score in rapid fire prone with 99-3X out of a possible 100. Good shooting, Tom!

2nd place went to Gary Thorson who shot a Springfield Armory M1A with open sights for a score of 444-6X. Gary also had the high score in slow fire standing with a score of 85-1X

3rd went to Kevin Neubert shooting an AR-15 for a score of 437-7X. Kevin also earned enough points in this match to become the 3rd CCRP Distinguished Rifleman for the 2020 season. Congratulations, Kevin!

The high score in rapid fire sitting was Rick Baldwin with 94-1X. Rick also took 4th place in the match.

Following the main match we had the gong challenge. Winner was Tom Schuettke with 9 hits out of 10 shots. Gary Thorson had 8 hits. Ken Horton 7 hits. Gary Baldwin 4 hits. Rick Baldwin and Kevin Neubert each had 3 hits.

To finish the day we had the Carbine Match. For this match, we used the old "5V" targets at 50 yards. The course of fire was 5 shots standing, 5 shots kneeling, and 10 shots prone, all in a time goal of 1 minute. We ran the course twice for a total of 40 shots. Hits in the black counted as 1 point, hits in the white were a miss.

The winner was Gary Thorson with 37 hits.

The October, November, and December matches will be the Old Soldier Match (30 round all slow fire prone) followed by the .22 Rimfire Rapid Fire Silhouette Match. Beginning next year, we will be going back to alternating between CMP and Old Soldier every month. Odd months will be CMP, and even months will be Old Soldiers. Also, we are going to change the format of the Old Soldier match next year. It will be a 40 round match consisting of: Slow Fire Prone, 10 rounds in 10 minutes

Rapid Fire Prone, 10 rounds in 90 seconds Rapid Fire Sitting, 10 rounds in 90 seconds

Slow Fire Standing, 10 rounds in 10 minutes.

## DO NOT SHOOT AT ROCKS

We are continuing to see evidence that people are shooting at rocks on the high power range and the pistol bay. Additionally, people are shooting at the large concrete ecology block next to the culvert at the 100 yard line.

#### THIS PRACTICE IS ABSOLUTELY UNACCEPTABLE!

Shooting at rocks and concrete WILL cause ricochets. We cannot have bullets ricocheting around or potentially leaving the club property.

**READ THE RANGE RULES**. You may only shoot at targets authorized in the range rules. All bullets **MUST** impact the berms.

Anyone caught shooting at rocks, concrete, or any other unauthorized targets will be brought before the Board of Directors for disciplinary action.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

NRA membership (required)

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
