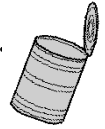

Board of Directors Meeting

March 20, 2021

7:00 p.m. Meeting called to order by Chris Moffet. Flag salute led by Will Ulry.

Roll Call by Brian Erickson. Those present: Chris Moffet, Doug Simpson, Will Ulry, Gary Thorson, Brian Erickson, Bob Greenman, Jerry Mayo, Tom Brown, Bob Delisle, Dan Johnson, Terry Mcmanus, Mike Nesbitt, Larry Balestra, Eric Boos, Bob Jamison, Nick Sanders, Richard Schneider.

Treasurer's report given by Doug Simpson. No questions on report. Mike Nesbitt motioned to accept the report as read. Motion seconded by Larry Balestra. Board vote: all "aye"

Membership status by Chris Moffet. Still growing.

Chris Moffet The Bookkeeper (Karla Moffet) needs the ability to request banking information. No need to write checks or withdraw funds. Tom Brown made a motion that the Bookkeeper (Karla Moffet) be allowed access to CCRP banking information, not to include writing or signing checks and withdrawing funds. Mike Nesbitt seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye"

Gary Thorson. Report on projects. Met with forester Mike Jackson and Gary's Bulldozing about four projects. 1. Black Powder Range parking & road maintenance. 2. Black Powder Range drainage. 3. Clubhouse parking maintenance. 4. Main access road maintenance & improvements. Mike Jackson has marked specific trees slated for removal for these projects and will get the required permits necessary. Project / CCRP events timing were discussed. Other projects discussed. Larry Balestra motioned to proceed with projects #1 & #3 with a "not-to-exceed" \$20,000.00. Jerry Mayo seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye"

Chris Moffet. Main Gate hold open issue. Many members reporting that the main gate has been left open with no one on site. Options discussed. The Board has decided to eliminate the hold open code for the main gate. E-mails will be sent to notify hold open code holders of this change.

Dan Johnson. Shared with the board his concern of an issue with a couple of members about carry positions and the definition of "down range".

Nick Sanders. Wants to use CCRP ranges to teach NRA basic pistol safety. Request discussed with CCRP bylaws in mind. Board decision: request granted with a \$20 per hour fee per class for commercial use.

Brian Erickson. Read the meeting minutes to the group. No corrections. Mike Nesbitt motioned to accept the minutes as read. Doug Simpson seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye".

8:55 p.m. Doug Simpson motioned to adjourn the meeting. Dan Johnson seconded the motion. Board vote: all "aye".

May M1 Garand Match

On Sunday, May 8, we held our second M1 Garand Match of the year. For the first match last month, only Tom Schuettke and Gary Thorson showed up. This time, we had 5 shooters on the line. (Much better).

Due to the current ammo shortage and inflated prices, we have decided to run all high power rifle matches this year as 40-round matches; 10 slow prone, 10 rapid prone, 10 rapid sitting, and 10 slow standing.

The match winner was Gary Thorson with a score of 364-5X. Gary was also the high score in rapid fire prone (97-3X) and rapid fire sitting (86). Gary earned enough points in this match to become the 2nd CCRP Distinguished Rifleman for the 2021 season.

2nd place was Tom Schuettke with 356-3X. Tom also had high score in the slow fire standing stage with a score of 90. 3rd place was Kevin Neubert with 325-5X. Kevin was high score in slow fire prone with 96-3X. (X's matter!)

The new format is proving to be popular with the shooters, but it is not as easy as it looks. That's why we call it a "challenge". If you want to have some fun, come out and join us.

Finally we ended the day with the .22 rapid fire silhouette match. Winner was Gary Thorson with the fastest time of 1:20. During one stage of the match, Tom Schuettke's magazine fell out of his rifle. Gary Thorson commented "Well, that's going to show up in the Plinker". Such comments have consequences. In Gary's next stage, his magazine fell out of his rifle. Tom insisted that be documented in the Plinker as well.

A Refresher on the Assessment

Years ago, our club initiated an annual assessment of \$80.00 on each membership as a means to encourage member participation in the maintenance and improvement of the club. The other side of the assessment meant the club could pay for non-members to do the work as needed. There are those who pay the assessment and those who work the hours. No problem with this – it is working out.

The assessment covers the year prior to the first day of the month of the member's anniversary date – (i.e.: 1 April, 1 May, etc.). If you are working the hours in lieu of the assessment, they have to be worked the year before. Hours do not carry over. There is a good number of members who work way more hours than the assessment needs to be brought to a zero balance but they do it for the good of the club. It's our club and the more WE take care of it, the better our facilities will be for us. The hours can be worked in full or partial. Eight hours equals the \$80.00. Four hours gets \$40.00 off leaving a \$40.00 balance.

The club has assessment cards for documenting the hours worked. It's a little yellow card just the right size to keep in your badge holder. The cards are available in a little box mounted in the front entry of the clubhouse, or in a box in the foyer inside the clubhouse, or you can get them from Range or Match directors. The front side of the card gets your name, address, and so on. The back is where you log your hours worked, the date, what you did, and a place for initials from who ever was facilitating the work. You need to remember to write the year on the card! That card – the original – gets mailed in with your dues and proof of NRA membership.

There are lots things that can be done to work the assessment hours and there are new opportunities in the works. Ask a Director if you want more information.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

Orientation class (required)

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Free listing of events on NRA website; discount on range technician team & service; attorney referral service; non-legal advice for legal problems; NRA attorneys pro bono for national concern issues; eligible to apply for \$5,000 grant annually; \$10 reimburse for each new NRA member; \$5 reimburse for each returning member; "Club Connection" quarterly magazine; eligible for NRA firearms insurance.
