## MISSION STATEMENT

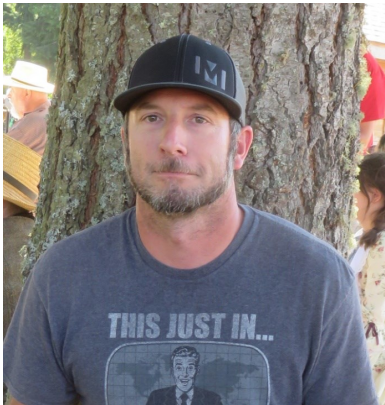

## OREGON TRAIL DAYS 2021

The warm fair weather didn't stop at least 32 shooters from signing up for the black powder shooting at Oregon Trail Days in Tenino. This was also the Washington State Muzzleloaders Association's formal (with paper targets) rifle match.

On Saturday morning at 9:00 the shooting started with the smoothbore Trade Guns. That took 10 shots, fired from 40 yards for 5 shots, then at 25 yards for the next five shots at our Moonshine Jug target. Then pistols were used for a 10-shot match. Following that came the Ladies' Match which was won by young Ayla Hamilton who was also our top shooter in the Junior Class.

Next came a break so some of our shooters could march in the Tenino parade. We got back to shooting at 2:00 that afternoon with the novelty matches. Those were three one-shot matches at a "V" and a candle (all on paper targets) plus a Mike Fink match. Bob DeLisle used his flintlock .40 caliber rifle to win all three of the novelty matches.

On Sunday morning the shooting started for the rifle aggregate which is actually the WSMA Formal Rifle Match. And it is an interesting match, beginning at 90 yards for five offhand shots, then to 75 yards for five shots either offhand or sitting with cross-sticks, followed by five more shots at 50 yards, and ending with 10 shots (on two different targets) at 25 yards. After firing at the longest distance target, the firing line moved closer to the next firing line because the targets were always in front of the natural berm to collect the bullets. And round balls were the only bullets acceptable for this match.

Lawrence Saltarelli won with the top aggregate score of 179-X out of a possible 250. He did his shooting with a percussion Lyman Great Plains Rifle and he really did a good job of it. And Lawrence followed in the good old Tenino tradition of taking the chair made by Will Ulry as his prize for winning 1<sup>st</sup> place.

Other traditional prizes were awarded as well. For the Trade Gun Match, all three places were awarded with new powder horns made and donated by Steve Skillman. The Mike Fink novelty match was awarded with a new 5<sup>th</sup> of whiskey. Both the Candle Snuff and the "V" match were award-

ed with pitchers of beer donated by the Landmark

Tavern. There were other prizes for certain events in addition to the WSMA medals and certificates for placement in the Pistol Match and all of the Rifle Matches that made up the aggregate. In addition to those prizes, all shooters were awarded with a worthy prize "off of the blanket" in order of their rifle aggregate score. ### MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
