It offers shooters six targets ranging from 350 yards, the only target shot offhand with the others shot from cross sticks, to 805 yards. # **Lever Gun Match**

Seven gun-slingers gathered for our monthly lever gun match on Saturday, the 10<sup>th</sup> of June, highly prepared for a smoking up a good time as well as a good score. We met on the <u>Bob Gietz Black Powder</u>



<u>Range</u> at the Capitol City Rifle and Pistol Club near Littlerock Washington.

We had an interesting and, for some, a challenging course of fire. That started with a buffalo target posted at 75 yards, shot from the sitting position with crosssticks. I managed to score the most points with 77, followed by Jerry Mayo with 68, and Bob Delisle rounding out the top three with a score of 61 points. Then we fell back to the 50-yard line with another buffalo target, this one with double bullseye scoring rings. This target was shot from the sitting position while using cross-sticks as well, with 5 shots fired at each bullseye. Mike Nesbitt scored the highest with 92X, and did I mention that Mike shot the entire match left-handed! Second place went to Jerry Mayo with 91 followed by Jeff "Loco" Ritter's 82 points. Our third target was a big turkey at

25 yards. This one was shot offhand or, as Jeff puts it, "awful-handed." Mike Nesbitt takes the honors with an original score of 94-X, but on closer examination and after the high fives were done, his score was actually 94-XX. Loco Jeff took the second place slot with a score of 78 and I grabbed the third-place honor with 75-XXX.

Something new was tried for the after-match. We shot a double bull target at 12 paces with our sixguns. Five shots were fired at each bullseye. But here's where the differences began; the bullseye on the right was shot one-handed using the right hand and then the left bullseye was shot at one-handed using the left hand. Ralph Birmingham won the after match with a score of 52X! Good shooting Ralph!

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

#### Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
