FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

My hope is that starting this early will generate more interest in our club's process of elections as well as greater participation for the club's general membership.

There are a number of board positions which are due for either re-election of the person holding that position or for the nomination and election of a new member to the board. These positions are simply nearing the end of their 3-year terms. They are; Treasurer (presently Doug Simpson), Security Officer & Information Technology (Richard Schneider), Action Pistol Range Director (Ron Lohman), Black Powder Range Director (Tom Witt), and the Hunter Education Director (Blayde Fry).

In addition to those board positions, all of the executive positions, being the president, vice president, treasurer, security officer, safety officer, and the secretary are voted on or elected annually. To be eligible for those positions nominees must be members of the club's Board of Directors.

When we consider someone for a position on our Board of Directors, one thing we can look at is their attendance record for our meetings. Those meetings are rather important and several of us have the hopes that participation at our meetings will increase. The record or roll call for present directors at our past meetings will be made available. Of course, there are justifiable excuses for missing meetings such as health problems or an employment schedule.

Also, a general observation shows that several black powder shooters are now on the Board of Directors. Those black powder shooters are simply interested in helping the club run along a good course. At the same time, things might seem more properly balanced if some members from other "shooting ranges" were to step up and take more active positions within the club by becoming board members.

So, there are certainly things to consider in either making nominations for board members or accepting a nomination. Let's begin making some of those considerations now so we can enjoy having a meaningful election for club board members and officers this December.

August Lever Gun Match By Tom Witt

We had a great turn out for the Lever Gun Match on the Bob Gietz Black Powder Range at the Capitol City Rifle and Pistol Club located in Littlerock Washington. 11 shooters in all came out to test their skills with the lever gun and for the after match we were playing with shotguns loaded with black powder.

Our match started with a small target with two scoring bulls shot off hand at 25 yards. While hanging our targets we discovered we had guests in the form of a ground hornet nest. I guess it is that time of year. In spite of the yellow devils Bob Delisle Scored the highest at 25 yards with an 86, followed by Allen Cuniff with a score of 84 and coming in 3rd place at 25 yards is yours truly with 82 points.



The next target was shot at 50 yards using cross sticks. It was our standard buffalo with the two scoring bulls. Mike Nesbitt took the high score with an impressive 97 3X! Great shooting Mike! He was followed by Jeff "loco" Ritter with a score of 95X, third in line at 50 yards was Allen Cuniff with a score of 91X. All three were impressive scores.

We finished off the match with the single bull buffalo target at 75 yards, shot with cross sticks. We still had some impressive scores with Mike Nesbitt and Allen Cuniff shooting an impressive 92. Mike takes first with a 92XX, and Allen with a 92X third place at 75 yards goes to Jeff "Loco" Ritter with a 87X.

For the after match, we decided to shoot our shotguns loaded with black powder. We shot at a total of 10 clays, 5 thrown from the right and 5 thrown from the left. Six shooters participated in the festivities while others helped with the scoring and throwing the clays. We had a close competition with my 16-gauge taking high score with 5 clays. New comer Jim Haeckel came in second using a borrowed 12 gauge from Mike Nesbitt. Mike's gun was used by Mike and by Jim, you might say that Mikes coach gun out shot me by hitting 6 clays between Jim and Mike. Another noteworthy tale is that Doc Ritter is the only one who managed to hit a double.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
