

MISSION STATEMENT

FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

As I said at the recent monthly meeting, mainly attended by the executive officers, last year I was a bit slow in getting any information out concerning our club's annual elections. This year we'll get things going much earlier than that...

Our club's elections won't take place until the December meeting and, generally, nominations must be made by the November meeting. For this year's elections, I will accept nominations, if the nominated member is willing to accept, at any time. The best place to make such nominations is, of course, at one of the coming meetings when the member being nominated is also present. My hope is that starting this early will generate more interest in our club's process of elections as well as greater participation for the club's general membership.

There are a number of board positions which are due for either re-election of the person holding that position or for the nomination and election of a new member to the board. These positions are simply nearing the end of their 3-year terms. They are; Treasurer (presently Doug Simpson), Security Officer & Information Technology (Richard Schneider), Action Pistol Range Director (Ron Lohman), Black Powder Range Director (Tom Witt), and the Hunter Education Director (Blayde Fry).

In addition to those board positions, all of the executive positions, being the president, vice president, treasurer, security officer, safety officer, and the secretary are voted on or elected annually. To be eligible for those positions nominees must be members of the club's Board of Directors.

When we consider someone for a position on our Board of Directors, one thing we can look at is their attendance record for our meetings. Those meetings are rather important and several of us have the hopes that participation at our meetings will increase. The record or roll call for present directors at our past meetings will be made available. Of course, there are justifiable excuses for missing meetings such as health problems or an employment schedule.

Also, a general observation shows that several black powder shooters are now on the Board of Directors. Those black powder shooters are simply interested in helping the club run along a good course. At the same time, things might seem more properly balanced if some members from other "shooting ranges" were to step up and take more active positions within the club by becoming board members.

So, there are certainly things to consider in either making nominations for board members or accepting a nomination. Let's begin making some of those considerations now so we can enjoy having a meaningful election for club board members and officers this December.

August Old West Centerfires

As we head into the home stretch of the season, we had one of our best attended shoots of the year. With sixteen shooters and less than one hundred points separating the top seven, this is lining up to be a good match. This month we had three shooters needing to submit scores from targets fired on a day previous to the match. The targets were shot in the presence of approved witnesses. Scores were verified prior to leaving the range and maintained by the Match Director until the day of the shoot. A practice we provide for those who are unable to attend but want to maintain building their aggregate score. Additionally, match day rules apply. No fouling or sighting shots.

I was Range Safety Officer for the day of our August match. Mike Nesbitt managed the prize table. Bob DeLisle and Mike Nesbitt worked the scoring table with me. Thanks to everyone who participated. The course of fire was our standard aggregate setup which consisted of ten shots at 100 yards at a single-bullseye target, ten more shots at a 200 yards single-bullseye target. The targets could be shot in any order the shooter chooses.

We had a first-time shooter join us on this day. Eric Johnson made his way to the range from the Portland, Oregon area. We appreciate Eric making the trip and hope to see more of him in the future.

September Lever Gun Match

On the second Saturday morning of the month, a small group of gunslingers gathered at the black powder trail head at Capitol City Rifle and Pistol Club, located just outside of Olympia Washington in Littlerock. Our numbers were small this month but we made up for it with enthusiasm. We met at 9:00am and the shooting started around 9:30. We set off in three groups to ring steel. It has been a while since we have walked the trail with lever guns so it was a nice change of pace from shooting paper.

There were 29 metal targets and a tie breaker shot which brought the total to 30 rounds fired. I was personally looking forward to this shoot, having just returned from the Fort Bridger and Bear River Rendezvous in Wyoming which consisted of over 150 rounds fired at paper targets. There is something rather satisfying about shooting reactive targets.



First place on the trail went to Allen Cuniff, he only missed one target, shooting his peep-sighted Henry replica in .44/40. Great shooting Allen! His trail partner Bob Delisle took the second place slot with old original .32/20 using black powder loads, getting 26 hits out of 29 shots. Mike Nesbitt, who was shooting his .44/40 Trapper carbine, and I were partnered on the trail. We were both shooting neck and neck, we both ended up with 24 hits but Mike beat me by just a tiny bit with the tiebreaker shot. Did I mention that he was shooting left-handed, which is becoming rather standard for him, it's a good thing I wasn't shooting lefty or there would have been a much larger spread in our scores in Mike's favor. Dan Johnson, Phil Wiebe, and Ralph Birmingham, all using .44/40 rifles, were partnered on the trail and from the smoke and clangs coming from them I am going to say a good time was

had by all.

I must mention that the trail was in excellent shape due to the work parties and efforts of Tom Brown and Derek Sotelo as they made preparations for the Fall Gathering Rendezvous which was held the week before.

We polished off the day's festivities with an after-match shooting our revolvers. The after-match was held on the black powder range with a bullseye target, shot at from 12 paces. The winner of the match with a very impressive 100-8X was Allen Cuniff. Once again, GREAT shooting Allen!

Many thanks go out to all those that participated and helped with scoring, and to the Black River Buffalo Runners for supplying the blanket prizes.

Indoor Air Gun Matches at CCR&P

There are two types of indoor air rifle matches at CCR&P.

There is Air Rifle Benchrest which is shot from a bench rest at targets 50 feet away. The course of fire is four targets of 25 record shots. Time for each target is 20 minutes. Match is a total of 100 record shots plus any sighters. Shooters compete in two classes; Air rifles that are spring powered (SPR) or by compressed air [precharged pneumatic (PCP) which includes single stroke pneumatic (SSP)].

The other Air Rifle match is a Field Target match which is also shot indoors at 50 feet. The targets are similar to silhouette shooting but have a hole varying in size in which the shooter has to shoot through to trigger a lever the causes the silhouette to fall down. The match is 40 shots for score. The shooters shoot twice at 20 targets. There are two classes; Field Target which is shot from a sitting position and Hunter Field Target where the shooter can use support sticks/cross sticks and sit on a stool.

These events are designed to give air rifle shooters the opportunity to test both the accuracy of their equipment and their individual skills in a friendly, competitive atmosphere away from the outside weather conditions. **These events are generally held once a month on Saturdays from October through March.** Check the Club's calendar and come on out and give it a try. The Fall .22 cal Precision Pistol League Starts October 2, 2023

The .22 cal Precision Pistol League is on Monday nights with a 6:30 and 7:30 pm relay. The shooting is done at 50 feet at the Indoor Range at targets with a bullseye (black center section). Course of fire consist of 60 rounds for score. There are three shooting sequences/types: Slow Fire (10 rounds in ten minutes), Timed Fire (5 rounds in 20 seconds) and Rapid Fire (5 rounds in 10 seconds). Twenty rounds are shot in each type. The shooting is done one-handed with open (iron) or optical sights (red dot or scope). Shooters may use a semi-auto or revolver however it is more difficult to shoot a revolver in Rapid Fire. Shooters may shoot with both hands for fun. The League runs for 11 weeks. Shooters submit 10 scores to be eligible for league awards. The League is NRA Sanctioned. The League cost is \$50.

WINTER INDOOR .22 RIFLE SHOOTING

Beginning on Wednesday, November 1st, we will have the Indoor Range open each Wednesday evening for .22 rifle shooting. This will be every Wednesday evening from Nov. 1 to the end of March 2024. This will be for CCRP Club members only; the gate will not be open so you will need your club key card to get in the gate. There will be no charge for these Wednesday night sessions, but you must be a CCRP Club member.

The Indoor Range door will be open at 6:00 PM. Shooting will start at 6:30 PM. This will be a semi-formal range session. We will have four 10-minute shooting sessions, with plenty of time between sessions to warm up by the wood stove and visit with your friends.

The firing line will be run by an NRA Certified Range Safety Officer. NRA A-17 50-foot rifle targets will be provided. If we run out of targets, we'll take up a small donation to buy more targets. You can bring your own targets if you want. You can shoot in any position you choose or set up a table and chair to shoot from the bench.

Any rifle chambered in .22 Short, .22 Long, or .22 Long Rifle may be used. No .22 Magnum or .17 caliber rimfires. Open sights or scopes may be used. This will be precision target shooting. No rapid fire "mag dumps" will be allowed.

Beginning in mid-December, several of us will form a team to participate in the National Rifle League "postal league". Any club member is welcome to join our team. If you don't want to shoot in the postal league, you can still come and shoot with us for recreation and fun.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES
Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$80.00** for the first member of each household and **\$45.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

Orientation class (required)

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
