#### FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

In addition to those board positions, all of the executive positions, being the president, vice president, treasurer, security officer, safety officer, and the secretary are voted on or elected annually. To be eligible for those positions nominees must be members of the club's Board of Directors.

When we consider someone for a position on our Board of Directors, one thing we can look at is their attendance record for our meetings. Those meetings are rather important and several of us have the hopes that participation at our meetings will increase. The record or roll call for present directors at our past meetings will be made available. Of course, there are justifiable excuses for missing meetings such as health problems or an employment schedule.

Also, a general observation shows that several black powder shooters are now on the Board of Directors. Those black powder shooters are simply interested in helping the club run along a good course. At the same time, things might seem more properly balanced if some members from other "shooting ranges" were to step up and take more active positions within the club by becoming board members.

So, there are certainly things to consider in either making nominations for board members or accepting a nomination. Let's begin making some of those considerations now so we can enjoy having a meaningful election for club board members and officers this December.

Our top shooter for the day was Allen Cunniff with a score of 184-X. Allen was shooting a C. Sharps Arms Model '74 in .40/65. Well done, Allen. Our number two shooter was Mike Holeman with 179-X using another '74 by C. Sharps Arms but in .45/70 caliber. Third was Mike Moran scoring 173-X with his '74 C. Sharps Arms in .45/70.

Behind Mike in fourth place was "Loco" Jeff Ritter with his Remington rolling block in .45/90 firing a 171-X. Rounding out the top five was Phil Wiebe with a 161-X, shooting his 1885 HiWall by C. Sharps in .38/50 Remington.

# **October Lever Gun Match**

We had a small gathering at our lever gun match this month, only 7 shooters braved the threat of rain to show up at the Bob Gietz Black Powder Range. We are located in the Capitol City Rifle a Pistol Club in Littlerock WA. The weather held off quite nicely for the entire shoot, but the moisture was a bit heavy in the air. I think if you were to go down to the black powder range the smoke might still be hanging there!

This was a paper shoot with targets at 25, 50, and 75 yards. Our first relay was turkey at 25 yards. Allen Cuniff was the top shot at that distance with a score of 87-4X, followed by me with a score of 81XX, and for third place it was Bob Delisle with a score of 65-X. The turkey target is a bit deceiving; it looks fairly easy especially at 25 yards but the high scoring rings are small and easy to miss.

Our next relay was at the 50-yard line. We shot at a buffalo with two bullseyes on it, shooting five shots at each of the bullseyes, firing from the sitting position using cross-sticks, counting all ten shots for the full score. Allen Cuniff was the high scorer again with 95-X followed by Bob Delisle with a 88-X and Mike Nesbitt came in third with 86-X. "Loco" Jeff Ritter would have been in the running but he had succumbed to "target blindness" and shot all 10 rounds at one bullseye.

The third relay was shot while sitting and using cross-sticks at 75 yards. This was a buffalo with one scoring ring or bullseye. Allen Cuniff was the best shot once more with a score of 93-X, great shooting Allen! Next was Mike Nesbitt with a score of 84 followed by Bob Delisle with a score of 82.

For the after-match, we shot revolvers at a paper target with two scoring rings, 5 shots at each ring. This was shot at 12 paces. I decided to shoot a cap and ball .44 Walker replica, using paper cartridges that I had made. Doc Ritter was shooting an 1858 Remington with a cartridge conversion cylinder. This didn't help either of us because Mike Nesbitt won the after-match with a score of 86-X while using his #3 New Model in .38 Special. Allen shot a very respectable target of 90 several X's but he suffered from the sane "target blindness" that Jeff did earlier, and put all his rounds in one scoring ring.

### Indoor Air Gun Matches at CCR&P

There are two types of indoor air rifle matches at CCR&P.

There is Air Rifle Benchrest which is shot from a bench rest at targets 50 feet away. The course of fire is four targets of 25 record shots. Time for each target is 20 minutes. Match is a total of 100 record shots plus any sighters. Shooters compete in two classes; Air rifles that are spring powered (SPR) or by compressed air [precharged pneumatic (PCP) which includes single stroke pneumatic (SSP)].

The other Air Rifle match is a Field Target match which is also shot indoors at 50 feet. The targets are similar to silhouette shooting but have a hole varying in size in which the shooter has to shoot through to trigger a lever the causes the silhouette to fall down. The match is 40 shots for score. The shooters shoot twice at 20 targets. There are two classes; Field Target which is shot from a sitting position and Hunter Field Target where the shooter can use support sticks/cross sticks and sit on a stool.

These events are designed to give air rifle shooters the opportunity to test both the accuracy of their equipment and their individual skills in a friendly, competitive atmosphere away from the outside weather conditions. These events are generally held once a month on Saturdays from October through March. Check the Club's calendar and come on out and give it a try. ## The Fall .22 cal Precision Pistol League Starts October 2, 2023

The .22 cal Precision Pistol League is on Monday nights with a 6:30 and 7:30 pm relay. The shooting is done at 50 feet at the Indoor Range at targets with a bullseye (black center section). Course of fire consist of 60 rounds for score. There are three shooting sequences/types: Slow Fire (10 rounds in ten minutes), Timed Fire (5 rounds in 20 seconds) and Rapid Fire (5 rounds in 10 seconds). Twenty rounds are shot in each type. The shooting is done one-handed with open (iron) or optical sights (red dot or scope). Shooters may use a semi-auto or revolver however it is more difficult to shoot a revolver in Rapid Fire. Shooters may shoot with both hands for fun. The League runs for 11 weeks. Shooters submit 10 scores to be eligible for league awards. The League is NRA Sanctioned. The League cost is \$50.

#### WINTER INDOOR .22 RIFLE SHOOTING

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually.
