# 2024 Indoor .22 Pistol League

CCR&P Club puts on two leagues each year. A Fall (Oct-Dec) and Winter (Jan-Mar) league are on Monday nights, each running for 10 weeks plus a couple of extra nights for make-up or practice. Think of it as a bowling league without the fancy shirts. Matches are held from 630pm-730pm and 730pm-830pm at the indoor clubhouse range. Each match is a total of 60 shots.

New shooters are highly encouraged to come watch and if you have a .22 pistol, you're encouraged to shoot a match for fun and see if it's something you may like.

It continues to be a very successful league filled with shooters who wanted to get off the couch and use their .22 pistols and maybe even challenge themselves to keep their skills up during the off season.

The match is run as a registered NRA INDOOR PRECISION PISTOL .22 match. A single match takes roughly 30-40 minutes to run and 10-15 minutes of scoring (and telling tales, lies and excuses).

A single match course of fire at 50 feet is as follows:

- 1 Slow-Fire target (10 minutes for 10 shots)
- 1 Slow-Fire target (10 minutes for 10 shots)
- 1 Timed-Fire target (20 seconds for 5 shots, another 20 seconds for 5 shots)
- 1 Timed-Fire target (20 seconds for 5 shots, another 20 seconds for 5 shots)
- 1 Rapid-Fire target (10 seconds for 5 shots, another 10 seconds for 5 shots)
- 1 Rapid-Fire target (10 seconds for 5 shots, another 10 seconds for 5 shots)

For scores to count, the shooter must shoot standing, one-handed. Those wanting to shoot supported or two-handed are welcome to shoot and practice but scores are not included in the league awards. League awards are based on submitting 10 scores and you'll have roughly 22 match opportunities with 2 matches held each Monday night.

The Indoor .22 League is a great excuse stay active, your skills sharp and improve your game while waiting for spring and summer shooting events to begin.

The league had tremendous turnout with 20 steady attendees turning in scores. Everyone enjoys the comradery and it's a lot like golf or bowling. The first few targets can be a little rough until you get your "swing" – then it becomes a game of steady improvement and tightening up your groups.

# Heeeelllllo CCRP'ers

My name is Gene White Jr. I am a new member of the club, and I am putting on a Multi-State CCW class on June 30, 2024, 10AM-1PM. It covers everything you need for a CCW permit in Oregon, Utah, and Arizona. The Utah permit gets you reciprocity in 34 states. The Arizona permit gets you reciprocity in 35 states. The fee includes everything you need to submit your application to any of the states. Included in the cost of the class is the information for each state's laws, fingerprint card (With fingerprints), copy of your driver's license, and passport quality picture.

#### **Additional State Fees:**

**Utah**: application fee is **\$63.25** for five years, and renewals are **\$25.00** for five years. Renewals are done by mail or through the internet.

**Arizona**: application fee is **\$60.00 for five years**; renewals are **\$43 every five years**. Renewals are done through the mail. You do not have to have an Oregon or Washington permit to be able to get an Arizona permit

This class begins with a review of Washington Firearm Laws and how to obtain a Washington Concealed Carry Permit, which includes the new WA laws and then Oregon Laws and how to obtain an Oregon Concealed Carry Permit (including a training certificate), and then the Utah Concealed Carry Class in its entirety.

The Utah Class covers:

- Utah Laws
- Federal Laws
- Basic Safety Rules
- Firearm Types and Actions
- Ammunition Function and Selection
- Malfunctions and Stoppage Drills
- Use of Deadly Force
- Interaction with Law Enforcement
- Interstate Travel with Firearms
- National Parks
- Indian Reservations

The instructor of the class is Shaun Curtain the NRA Region-4 Training Counselor (Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, & Montana). He has been an NRA counselor for over 31 years. Training Counselors train the instructors and train the trainers.

NRA instructor certifications include: rifle, pistol, shotgun, muzzle loading rifle-pistol-shotgun, home firearm safety, personal protection inside the home, personal protection outside the home, range safety officer, chief range safety officer, metallic cartridge reloading, shotgun shell reloading, refuse to be a victim regional counselor, and rifle coach. NRA law enforcement firearm instructor for rifle & shotgun.

The cost of the course is \$120.00 per person. If we can get enough people in the class we can bring the price of the class down to \$100.00 per person.

# **OLD WEST CENTERFIRES**

This month our Black River Buffalo Runners took their chances with cartridges loaded with the venerable paper patch bullets in our annual Paper Patch Match. Volumes have been written, including on these pages, about the paper patch bullets. Some shooters love them and others despise them but none can deny, those paper patched bullets remain a major part of the evolution of firearms and a hold an important place in the history of the American Old West.

As always, we welcome all big bore black powder cartridges applicable to the "buffalo era." However, those who were shooting non-paper patch bullets will be scored separately for this event. We shot under the threat of rain but the overcast skies provided excellent target visibility. So, let's see how it all played out.

The course of fire was the same as we use in our aggregate matches which consists of ten shots at 100 yards at a single-bullseye target, ten more shots at 200 yards on a larger single bullseye target. The targets may be shot in any order the shooter chooses. All shooters regardless of bullet-type were awarded from the prize table.



# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

#### Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
