August's Record-Breaking Lever-Gun Match By Mike Nesbitt

We had just seven shooters, but those shooters all did rather well and, as some of us have said before, these lever-gun matches are certainly the most fun of our black powder events.

In this match, we started with the big turkey target at just 25 yards. That's a big target but the scoring area, at the neck and the head, is rather small. When aiming and shooting at the turkey's head, which we do from the offhand position, it is very easy to miss. I almost did that, one of my shots can be seen in the picture a bit high and slightly to the right but it did nick the turkey's head which is all that's needed for score. And my score was a 99-4X which sets a new record for out matches using this target.

Our next target was the buffalo that we use at 50 yards, shooting from a sitting position while using cross-sticks. This particular target does not have a bullseye for an aiming point and the 10 area (there is no X) is just above the foreleg. The 10 area is not very large and there is no 9-ring or 9 area, the next score is an 8. I was able to raise my score from the last match by shooting a score of 84, which was done with a group which had eight 8s and two 10s. But beating me was Allen Cunniff and I think he set a new record for this target by scoring an 88 with his peep-sighted iron framed Henry rifle in .44/40.

The third target in this 30-shot match was a standard 50-yard pistol bullseye which we posted at 75 yards. Again, we shot from the sitting position while using cross-sticks. I was rather pleased with my shooting and my score of 87 on that target but then Allen's target had a of score of 92-X, and Jerry Johnson's target showed a 93-2X, but those were beat by Jerry Mayo's pulverized target with a score of 97-4X! I'm sure Jerry Mayo has set a new record for the high score at 75 yards, and good for Jerry! Jerry was shooting his peep-sighted Model 1866 copy with the 24-inch barrel.

Then we had an after-match with revolvers. The target our match manager "Loco Jeff" Ritter had picked for us was the doublebullseye pistol target and we were to shoot 5 shots at each bullseye. Those shots had to be fired one-handed, holding the revolver with the right hand for the right-hand bullseye, and held with the left hand for the left-hand bull. Jerry Johnson easily won that with a score of 74, shooting with his 1851 Navy in .36 caliber. I thought that might be a new record too but Mike Holeman still holds the record with a score of 78, shot with his new-at-that-time Colt Flat-top copy in .44-40. So, Jerry took the pot!

We can easily guess that the seven of us who participated in this match are certainly glad we came to do some good shooting. How very good the shooting was can be seen in the record-breaking scores. Let's be sure to do it again so these new records can be broken once more, as soon as possible. In anticipation of doing that, let's keep our rifles cleaned and our ammo tested and reloaded.

M1 Garand Match

The August M1 Garand Match saw a modest turnout of 5 shooters. But there was no shortage of a good time.

All of our high power rifle matches follow the same course of fire, and are 50 round matches at 200 yards as follows:

- 10 rounds slow fire standing in 10 minutes (max 100 points)
- 10 rounds rapid fire sitting in 60 seconds (max 100 points)
- 10 rounds rapid fire prone in 70 seconds (max 100 points)
- 20 rounds slow fire prone in 20 minutes (max 200 points)

Which makes for a maximum total score of 500 points.

The M1 Garand Match is intended for the "U.S. Rifle Cal. .30 M1", more commonly known as the "M1 Garand" after its inventor John C. Garand. The M1 Garand was the standard issue U.S. military rifle from 1936 to 1958.

However, we welcome shooters to come and shoot whatever rifle you have in any of our high power rifle matches, as long as you follow along with the prescribed course of fire. As you can see below, one of our shooters competed with an AR-15 Carbine, because he doesn't have an M1.

The course of fire this day was our standard aggregate setup which consisted of ten shots at 100 yards at a single-bullseye target, then ten more shots at 200 yards single with another, larger, bullseye target. The targets may be shot in any order the shooter chooses. Cartridges had to be loaded with black powder and lead cast bullets. Our shooting is done from the sitting position with cross-sticks.

For this match we had two shooters needing to submit scores from targets fired previous to the match. Those targets were shot in the presence of approved witnesses. Scores were verified along with the other targets by the Match Director on the day of the shoot. So, with this good turnout, let's see how the scores ran.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as quests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
