### October's Lever Gun Match

October brings cooler weather and sometimes fog. This didn't dampen the enthusiasm of our 11 shooters who showed up for this month's lever-gun match. We shoot this match with ammunition loaded with black powder and cast lead bullets. It's a fun way to remember the 1870s.

We arrived ready to shoot paper targets at distances ranging from 25 to 75 yards. With the help of cross-sticks, there were some impressive scores turned in.

Beginning with our favorite "turkey" target at 25 yards, we did our shooting offhand. Bob Delisle showed us how this was done, with his Model 1892 Winchester in .32-20 caliber, by shooting a score of 95-XX. He was followed by Jerry Johnson, using a Model 1873 in .44-40, who shot a 91-X. Third place went to Mike Holeman with another .44-40, shooting a score of 86.

Next was the double-bull buffalo shot from the sitting position over cross-sticks at 50 yards. Allen Cunniff, with his iron framed Henry rifle in .44-40, inched passed me with a score of 91-X. My score, with my '73 in .44-40, was just one point behind Allen's at 90-X. Third-place at 50 yards went to Bob Delisle with a score of 88-XX.

The 75-yard target wrapped things up for the lever guns with a single bull buffalo target shot from the sitting position again, with cross-sticks. The sun had decided to come out very brightly from behind the trees and make it VERY difficult for us to see the targets. With the bright sun, combined with the lingering smoke from all the black powder guns, it's a wonder we hit our marks at all. Jerry Mayo stepped up, in spite of the challenges, shooting his Model 1866 in .44-40 caliber, with the highest 75-yard score of 85-X. Jerry was followed by Allen Cunniff who scored an 82. Finally, we have Jerry Johnson with a, not too shabby, score of 76-X.

Our after match was held after we were finished shooting with the lever guns. We dusted off our .22 rifles for this match and shot at the standing bear target in honor of our friendly black bear that has been spotted on the range several times over the summer and as recently as October 1<sup>st</sup>. Allen Cunniff took the winnings with a score of 94-5X. Mike Nesbitt and I were close behind with scores of 91-4X and 91-5X respectively. Unfortunately, there are no winnings for second or third in this "winner-take-all" competition.

I would like to thanks everyone who participated and helped with scoring and such. A special thanks to Mike Nesbitt and the Black River Buffalow Runners for providing the blanket prizes.

We're all looking forward to next month's Lever-gun match! If you have an interest in lever guns, firing black powder loads, we would love to see you there.

## MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

#### Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
