November's Lever Gun Match

Wes Davis came back from Walla Walla to enjoy the match. It was nice to see him again. We met at the Bob Gietz Black Powder Range at Capitol City Rifle and Pistol Club at 9:00am. Shooting started at 9:30am; weather was cooperative with the rain holding off until we were mostly finished.

We had 12 shooters, shooting ten rounds at each target, 30 rounds total. The real contest for the day was between Bob DeLisle and Jerry Johnson. Bob DeLisle beat Jerry's fine shooting and score by just one point. Bob also had a couple of X's to his credit just in case they were needed.

Jerry Nelson, from Montana, expressed some interest in finding out what all the fuss was about, so Mike Nesbitt invited him to come check out the spectacle for himself. Not only did Jerry show up but he jumped right in and helped with the after-match by running the clay pigeon thrower! Hopefully we will be seeing more of Jerry and he is signed up to attend a New Member Orientation.

Our after-match we used our shotguns, shooting black powder loads. Six of us brought our double-barreled blasters out and did our best to hit 10 flying clay pigeons. We were shooting 12ga, 16ga and .410 bore guns loaded with with lead bird shot. I managed to rise victorious, on what might be called the "come-back trail" by hitting 7 out of 10 clays. Bob DeLisle nearly tied me with six.

Beginning with the January Lever-Gun Match, we will start a yearly aggregate like the one we have for the Old West Centerfires Matches, where at the conclusion of the year's shooting, most likely the match we expect to hold in December, 2025, we'll award prizes for that match plus additional awards for the year's aggregate. Final details have not been discussed but we can expect that the aggregate score will be based on the totals of the scores from perhaps six of the year's Lever-Gun Matches, not counting matches shot on the trail-walk, minus one match score. That is done so shooters can miss a match without suffering the loss of points. With these changes, we hope to encourage and attract a few more shooters.

The match winner was Tom Schuettke with a score of 482-17X out of a possible 500 points. Gary Thorson was close behind with 479-9X. It was a very close match throughout, with each stage separated by only 1 or 2 points. This was a lot of fun, and that's the name of the game.

Following the main match, we had our usual gong challenge. The course of fire was to shoot 10 gongs at distances between 50 and 200 yards as fast as possible. Each miss was a 10 second penalty. Only Gary and Tom participated, and Gary won.

We ended the day with the Carbine Match. We shot at 25-yard pistol targets placed at 50 yards. Each hit in the Black was 1 point; hits in the white were 0. The course was to shoot 5 rounds standing, 5 rounds kneeling, and 10 rounds prone, all in a time limit of 1 minute. We ran the course twice for a total of 40 rounds, or 40 points possible. The winner was Gary Thorson with 34 hits in the black.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES
Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$80.00** for the first member of each household and **\$45.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

Orientation class (required)

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old as guests as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
