2024 Indoor .22 Pistol League

CCR&P Club puts on two leagues each year. A Fall (Oct-Dec) and Winter (Jan-Mar) league are on Monday nights, each running for 10 weeks plus a couple of extra nights for make-up or practice. Think of it as a bowling league without the fancy shirts. Matches are held from 6:30pm-7:30pm and 7:30pm-8:30pm at the indoor clubhouse range. Each match is a total of 60 shots. New shooters are highly encouraged to come watch and if you have a .22 pistol, you're encouraged to shoot a match for fun and see if it's something you may like.

It continues to be a very successful league filled with shooters who wanted to get off the couch and use their .22 pistols and maybe even challenge themselves to keep their skills up during the off season.

The match is run as a registered NRA INDOOR PRECISION PISTOL .22 match. A single match takes roughly 30-40 minutes to run and 10-15 minutes of scoring (and telling tales, lies and excuses). A single match course of fire at 50 feet is as follows:

For scores to count, the shooter must shoot standing, one-handed. Those wanting to shoot supported or two-handed are welcome to shoot and practice but scores are not included in the league awards. League awards are based on submitting 10 scores and you'll have roughly 22 match opportunities with 2 matches held each Monday night.

The Indoor .22 League is a great excuse stay active, your skills sharp and improve your game while waiting for spring and summer shooting events to begin.

The league had tremendous turnout with 22 steady attendees turning in scores. Everyone enjoys the comradery and it's a lot like golf or bowling. The first few targets can be a little rough until you get your "swing" – then it becomes a game of steady improvement and tightening up those groups.

The months that will count toward the aggregate are January, February, May, July, September, November. You can throw out your lowest score because we will only count 5 out of the 6 aggregate scores. If you missed this month's match, that's okay we still have 5 aggregate months left.

Thirteen and a half shooters showed up for this match. The half-shooter being Bob Delisle who had door lock issues with his pick-up and showed up too late to compete in the rifle match but he did help with scoring and then shot his revolver the after-match. He even managed to take a couple shots at a gong with a lever gun with black powder ammunition.

OLD WEST CENTERFIRES

We shot our after-match first with revolvers using black powder loads. The target was a bullseye which was posted at ten yards. With a score of 99-6X, Mike Nesbitt took the purse. Good shooting Mike.



The course of

fire for this OWC match was our standard aggregate setup which consists of ten shots at 100 yards at a single-bullseye target, ten more shots at a 200 yards single bullseye target. Those targets may be shot in any order the shooter chooses. Cartridges must be loaded with black powder and lead cast bullets. Shooting is done from the seated position with cross-sticks. The match is shot in thirty-minute relays in which all twenty scoring shots must be fired. Fouling shots are allowed. So, let us look at how our Buffalo Runners did on this year's opening day. MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS</u>: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
