SPECIAL OLD-TIME .22 MATCH

Time rolled around again for our yearly Special Old-time .22 Match which we shoot with .22 single shot rifles, at least most of the time. It was said that way because we do not "outlaw" any repeating .22 rifles except semi-autos. Manually operated .22 repeaters can still be fired single-shot but that's too tough to do with most semi-autos. And, after we shot this match, we all agreed that it is so much fun that we'll try to do it maybe as often as four times per year. We'll have to work on that.



Because shooting "single-shot" was mentioned in the paragraph above, that is the way we prefer to do our shooting. One good reason for that is because if a cease-fire is needed to be called, all of the rifles must be emptied and set in the gun racks behind the firing line.

On our firing line during the .22 match you can see rolling blocks, like Jerry Mayo's Remington Number 4, several Stevens Favorite rifles, at least a few of C. Sharps Arms' copies of the Hopkins & Allen .22 (we hope they'll make more), and sometimes a big bore rifle with a .22 caliber barrel insert like the big rolling block used by Jerry Johnson. My Low-wall in .22 LR usually makes an appearance but my H&A got the job this time.

"Loco Jeff" Ritter usually runs this match but he had absconded to Arizona, so Jerry Mayo and I put this particular .22 match together. We selected five different targets, each for ten shots,

making this a 50-shot match. Three of the targets were posted at 25 yards, two of those were shot from the offhand position while the other one was shot while sitting and behind cross-sticks.

The other two targets were both posted at 50 yards and both of them were shot over cross-sticks. This made the shooting good and our eleven shooters had a real good time.

Kelle Davis and Jerry Johnson both shot scores of 99 on their crow targets. Mike Nesbitt got the high score at 50 yards on the turkey target and Jerry Mayo beat that with a 91 on the bullseye. For a better look at the scores, just peek at the list below.

Now we're going try planning on doing this type of match more often. Grab a good old-style .22 and join us.

For this match 9 "Lever-gunners" turned out that was counting Bob Delisle who shot his targets earlier in the week. This was an aggregate match, so we were shooting paper targets at the usual distances of 25, 50, and 75 yards. We did have to change up some of the targets due to some wasps that had moved into the target cabinet inside the shed. Those wasps even taught this match director how to fly as the shed was exited!

Our first target was a running fox at 25 yards, shot off hand. This target was chosen because it was available from our club house target stash. I thought I had eradicated the wasps in our shed but found out the hard way that there was still plenty available ready to defend their home. After three stings, a wounded pride, one "crash landing" below the shed's steps, and with more wasp killer, the job of killing those wasps was finally complete. At least until next time, when I'll be more careful.

Bob Delisle had the best score on the fox target with 84-3X, then we had Jerry Mayo (83-X) and Allen Cunniff (82) taking 2nd and 3rd respectively.

Our second target was the double bullseye buffalo which was posted at 50 yards. This target was shot from the sitting position with the aid of cross-sticks. The high score for this target went to Mike Nesbitt with a total score, shooting five shots at each bullseye, of 96-2X with his 30-inch barreled '73 in .44-40. Next were Jerry Mayo with 92-X and Allen Cunniff who shot a 91-X.

Our third target was a standard bullseye target posted at 75 yards, again, shot from the sitting position with the helpful aid of cross-sticks. This target was a bit smaller in size due to the wasps guarding the target we normally use. That made this target a little harder to see, but it didn't stop Jerry Mayo from shooting a score of 87 with his Model 1866 lever-gun in .44-40 caliber. I tied with Allen Cunniff for second place with a score of 84, so let's say we both earned that 2nd place. Bob Delisle had the third highest score of 80.

This month's after-match was done with shotguns. We only had four shooters, but that didn't stop the fun! We shot ten rounds at clay targets. High score was Allen Cunniff who hit 9 out of ten, I think that is a new record! A special thanks goes to Doc Ritter and Mike Nesbitt for throwing the clays and keeping score.

Our next match is the second Saturday in August. It is not an aggregate match so we will do some novelty shooting to shake things up a bit. Thanks to everyone that helped with set up, cleanup, prizes and scoring. A special thanks to Mike Holeman who helped battle the wasps!

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$80.00 for the first member of each household and \$45.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
